Dr. Cynthia Willson joined Inotiv in 2022 through its acquisition of Integrated Laboratory Systems (ILS), where she had been employed since 2014. Dr. Willson is an Investigative Pathologist for Inotiv where she functions as an onsite Division of Translational Toxicology (DTT) Pathologist (Contractor) at the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences/NIH. Dr. Willson also co-leads the Division of the DTT Global Training Program in Toxicological Pathology.

Dr. Willson is a member of the International Harmonization of Nomenclature and Diagnostic Criteria (INHAND) working group for the male reproductive system and the Society of Toxicologic Pathology (STP) Scientific and Regulatory Policy Committee Carcinogenesis Working Group. She serves on the Editorial Board of *Toxicologic Pathology* and is a former Chair of the STP Membership Committee and a former Chair of the STP Reproductive Pathology Special Interest Group. Dr. Willson has authored or co-authored over 30 publications or book chapters.

Dr. Willson received her veterinary degree at North Carolina State University College of Veterinary Medicine after completing her Ph.D. in Biology at Duke University. She completed a residency in anatomic pathology and an NIH postdoctoral fellowship in comparative reproductive pathology at Wake Forest University School of Medicine. Dr. Willson is a Diplomate of both the American College of Veterinary Pathology and the American Board of Toxicology. She is the 2024 recipient of the STP Distinguished Early Career Award.
